Dear ANZSCTS members,

I am writing to you as ANZSCTS Society President to update you on the challenges facing the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons (RACS). Whilst as a Society we are in a strong position with excellent corporate governance, RACS has increasingly realised that their business model of the past decades may not be the best, nor the most efficient, looking to the future. RACS has flagged a "review of College activities and operations". Whilst RACS has sought to address "operating with respect" over the past 8 years, it now needs to modernise operations and streamline business back to core areas: selection for surgical specialty programs, surgical training and assessment, hospital accreditation and ongoing professional development and advocacy.

College Fellows and Trainees recently received an update from the RACS president (Royal Australasian College of Surgeons <<u>RACS.Communications@surgeons.org</u>> Date: 15/6/23 Subject: Message from the President) outlining the college's current situation. The new RACS executive team has identified significant financial pressures facing RACS and has appointed a special advisor to advise on financial sustainability and more efficient corporate governance. The College is also looking to establish a governing board, to be advised by the Council of Fellows. The College is also considering an increase to Fellow and Trainee memberships, courses and workshop fees. As yet we have not been given specific level for the increase. Attached to this letter is a copy of the numerous college committees (168 Committees and working groups). RACS currently has over 250 employees.

The ANZSCTS executive is monitoring the RACS developments closely. We have requested more information from RACS about the specifics of their financial "redesign" and rationalisation of staff and services. We are keen to ensure trainees are not unfairly impacted by the changes. We believe RACS needs to focus upon core business delivery, and committees must be restructured to reflect this focus upon essential work. Furthermore, appropriately qualified RACS staff must be available to support all the surgical specialties.

We need a strong Society to represent Cardiac and Thoracic Surgeons in Australia and New Zealand.

 - Cardiac Accreditation Services Limited (accredits/re accredits operators and hospitals for TAVI, Mitraclip <u>www.tavi.org.au</u>
 - Prosthesis List reforms
- National Registry of Databases (Cardiac, Thoracic and Congenital).
 - Restructure of ACSRI (ANZCTSRI) to operate the Registries.
- Annual ASMs (ANZSCTS ASM Wellington 2023, RACS ASC Adelaide 2023)–Highly successful, professionally organised conferences fully funded by the Society (with Sponsors). Member discount on registration
- Trainee workshops and grants
 - The Biannual CTS workshops are professionally organised and **fully funded by ANZSCTS.** Trainees do not pay registration fees for these workshops.

- ANZSCTS Avant Trainees dinner at the ASM.
- SET 1 and 2 Trainee ANZSCTS membership is free. Fees for SET 3 to 6 are heavily discounted (subsidised by ANZSCTS FELLOWS)
- Grants:

- Substantial discount of insurance premiums to ANZSCTS members only from AVANT who is our Affinity MDO partner.

In summary, ANZSCTS is your Society. We are in a strong position to advocate for our members and our specialty. As always, the Executive encourages all members to get involved, for the more we speak out, the more we will be listened to. We are privileged to be able to make such a positive difference to our patients' lives, and we should continue to strive to make that difference.
